(1) CALL TO ORDER

The in-person and virtual NWARPC Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) Meeting was called to order by Chair Patsy Christie at 10:30 a.m.

(2) ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

In-person attendees named themselves, with Elizabeth Bowen naming the virtual attendees. Nicole Gibbs recorded member names and tallied votes. A quorum was reached.

(3) APPROVAL OF THE JUNE 15, 2023 TAC MEETING MINUTES

Chair Christie asked the Committee whether there were any additions or corrections to the meeting minutes and hearing none, requested a motion to approve the June 15, 2023 TAC Meeting Minutes.

MOTION: Mayor Chris Moore made a motion to approve the June 15, 2023 TAC Meeting Minutes. Paul Libertini provided the second. Motion passed unanimously.

(4) FY 2024 STBGP-A/TAP/CRP PROPOSED PROJECT PRESENTATIONS BY APPLICANTS

Chair Christie introduced the item with Elizabeth Bowen saying the applicants will be presenting their projects today in alphabetical order. She summarized available funding expected as follows:

NWARPC FY 2024 Programs:

- Surface Transportation Block Grant Program Attributable (STBGP-A)- approx. \$11.0M
- Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)- approx. \$ 1.2M
- Carbon Reduction Program (CRP)- approx. \$ 1.3M approx. \$13.5M

Bowen summarized the FY 2024 funding programs timeline as follows:

- Application Deadline (Resolution Required) July 14, 2023, at 4:00pm
- Project Sponsor Presentation to TAC Committee July 20, 2023 at 10:30am

- TAC Recommendation to RPC/Policy August 23, 2023 at 1:30pm

Bowen said project sponsors will have two minutes to present their projects. There was discussion regarding the maximum grant amount to any single project being half of the available funding within

the program. Bowen summarized the applications received and said several projects applied for multiple funding sources. She said \$22.8 million has been requested:

Bowen summarized the funding program requirements as follows:

- Resolution required
- 80% federal/20 local matching (in cash)
- This is a reimbursable program
- Follow ARDOT Local Public Agency (LPA) Manual federal-aid process (ARDOT TRAINING CLASS CLASS)
- Funds must be used for eligible projects
- STBGP-A must be a functionally classed road
- Funds must be obligated by Sep 2024

Bowen summarized the timeline for the Local Public Agency (LPA) Manual and the project development process. She summarized eligible activities and NWARPC focus areas for the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP).

Project applicants gave presentations of their requests.

Bowen confirmed the participants of the review committee and said a doodle poll has been distributed to establish a date and the site visit was confirmed for August 2, 2023. She said the site visit will be an all-day trip to visit the project sites and will also include discussions of scoring and recommendation. She said we will look specifically at the ability of projects to meet the obligation deadline. She said we have over \$22 million in requests, and \$13 million of funding, and many applicants will very likely not be awarded and will have to re-apply in the next funding cycle. She asked whether there were any questions.

Chair Christie said we have always had enough applicants for the money, and we have never let any of the money go back.

(5) ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) CLIMATE POLLUTION REDUCTION GRANT (CPRG) – Agreement with Arkansas Energy & Environment (AEE) – *Information Only*

Chair Patsy Christie said in the interest of time, we are going to move through some of this quickly. She said this item is for information only, and slides and more information will be distributed to the committee following the meeting.

(6) PROJECTS AND OTHER UPDATES

A. FY 2023 STBGP-A/TAP/CRP - Project Development

Chair Christie introduced the item and Elizabeth Bowen said we just heard about requests for FFY 2024 funding, and now we will discuss where we are with obligating last year's FFY 2023 awards. She said this year we have had trouble getting Agreements of Understanding (AoU's) and still have seven (7) missing agreements. She said we have a \$1 million carryover limitation, however, ARDOT has verbally said that we will not lose the CRP funds due to delay with agreements. She summarized the following FFY 2023 project status table:

Bowen summarized the projects currently in inactive status, particularly those that are on the current obligation plan. She said inactive projects need to move to the next step and submit reimbursement requests, as soon as possible as it will take several weeks to process on ARDOT's side. She asked if there were any questions and there were none.

B. Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Implementation Grants Update

In an interest of time, Elizabeth Bowen said we will distribute the slides for this item.

Bowen said we had previously announced that since we had already adopted the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP) prior to USDOT getting the agreement of understanding to us, that we may be able to complete supplemental planning and demonstration projects with that funding. She said we have since heard that USDOT plans to rescind the funds. She said we followed up stating that although we did adopt a plan, there were many aspects of our scope of work that were not completed, including two demonstration projects, two safety videos, and several other things. She said they responded that they would review and let us know if they will approve the use of the funds.
